H2O For Life Update

Dear Faculty, Staff, Students and Parents of Our Lady of Peace,

As the “liaison” between OLP and the progress made at the Shaikhan School in Afghanistan, I am thrilled to update you on our efforts to bring fresh water and sanitation to a community so desperately in need.

Last year, through an all school service project, OLP was able to raise more than eight thousand dollars to fund a sustainable water supply project at a school located twenty kilometers north of Kabul. As many of you know, my brother, Mike, who works for our State Department, was assigned to Kabul, for this next year. Coincidentally, he has been asked to direct sustainable water supply efforts within the country. What a fantastic opportunity that gave me to ask him to visit the school we funded, and report back to us on the progress being made!

Over the summer, I crafted a letter on behalf of our community, to share with the school children, upon his visit. I sent some pictures of our Walk-a-Thon, as well as the 6th Grade Opera that started this all. Last week, Mike visited the school, with the letter and the pictures, and his report was very moving and uplifting.

I would like to share with you some quotes from e-mails I have received, not only from Mike, but from others who have been involved in making this a reality:

“We visited the Shaikhan School this morning and the visit turned out to be so much more than I expected. I was shown the facilities and improvements and the program was explained to me in full. I saw the Bill of Materials and the finished products: the operational well pump (solar); the drinking water and hand washing facilities and reservoirs; the distribution systems; and the latrine facilities. We were given demonstrations showing how the water storage and distribution systems work, how the latrine facilities are now more sanitary and can be cleaned and of course the children showed us their clean hands.

“Tetra Tech ARD, and their partner IRG, have performed admirably and have put together water and sanitation facilities that will withstand the constant use and will be sustainable for many years. The school and the village of Shaikhan have received significant benefit from this project. H2O for Life and OLP, Columbus, Ohio should be commended for their efforts promoting and supporting this project. While USAID is involved as an agent of sorts here, the money raised by OLP is indeed impressive. But what the kids in Ohio learned about Afghanistan and water security and the simplest of benefits realized by the children in Shaikhan is tremendous.

From the USAID-Afghanistan Clean Energy Program (sent to Mike):

It was a pleasure to meet you and your colleagues at the Shaikhan School on Thursday. I was very impressed by the dedication of the teachers and principal, and admire the individual efforts being undertaken to improve the school by you, the school in Columbus and Mir and Fatima. The girls were wonderful, with their singing and speeches of appreciation.

We want to thank you too for organizing the US Embassy visit, which we know was not easy. I think your reading the Columbus, OH, school dedication touched the students, teachers and principal of the Shaikhan Girl’s School.

I, too, was impressed by witnessing girls washing their hands upon leaving the improved latrine premises. Mir and I will make sure to follow up on having the principal and parents make soap readily available at the hand washing tap reservoirs.

They cope, laugh, pursue education, and love family like any of us. Thank you so very much for all you did in making their basic dream come true.
