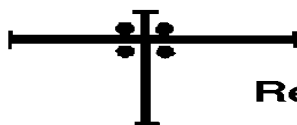

Our Lady of Peace School Board Candidates – Election March 5 & 6, 2011

Voting for 3 new OLP School Board members will take place on March 5 and 6, 2011. All three positions are three-year terms beginning with the 2011/2012 school year. Ballots will be available in the pews next weekend. All adult parishioners are eligible to vote. Completed ballots are to be placed in the boxes that will be available by the church doors. The candidates for the two of the positions representing school parents are Andy Bott, Seth Flory and Margaret (Muffy) Schuler. A parishioner that does not have children attending OLP School must fill a third position. The candidate eligible for that position is Paul Casper. Candidates' brief statements follow.

Andy Bott

As a member of the Our Lady of Peach School Board, my responsibilities are to ensure that our Catholic faith is a factor in all facets of the students and faculty's life. I will work to provide parents with the support they need to raise their children. I will work to ensure we provide the children the best education, best facilities and the best environment possible for each child to succeed on to the next level.

My name is Andy Bott. I am a graduate of Christ the King elementary school, Bishop Hartley High School and Franklin University. I married my wife Anne in 2005 and welcomed her sons Brian (14) and Greg (12) into my life. Anne and I have two children, Noah (5) and Tessa (3).
