Eusebius
of Vercelli
Bishop

Born on the isle of Sardinia, he became a member of the Roman clergy and is the first bishop of Vercelli in Piedmont. He is also the first to link the monastic life with that of the clergy, establishing a community of his diocesan clergy on the principle that the best way to sanctify his people was to have them see a clergy formed in solid virtue and living in community.

He was sent by Pope Liberius to persuade the emperor to call a council to settle Catholic-Arian troubles. When it was called at Milan, Eusebius went reluctantly, sensing that the Arian block would have its way, although the Catholics were more numerous. He refused to go along with the condemnation of Athanasius; instead, he laid the Nicene Creed on the table and insisted that all sign it before taking up any other matter. The emperor put pressure on him, but Eusebius insisted on St. Athanasius' innocence and reminded the emperor that secular force should not be used to influence Church decisions.

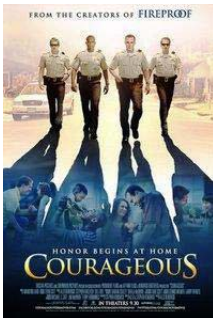
At first the emperor threatened to kill him, but later sent him into exile in Palestine. There the Arians dragged him through the streets and shut him up in a

little room, releasing him only after his four-day hunger strike. They resumed their harassment shortly after.

His exile continued in Asia Minor and Egypt, until the new emperor permitted him to be welcomed back to his see in Vercelli. He attended the Council of Alexandria and approved the leniency shown to bishops who had wavered. He also worked with St. Hilary of Poitiers against the Arians. He died peacefully in his own diocese at an advanced age.

Catholic Reading

Rising Road: A True Tale of Love, Race, and Religion in America
By: Sharon Davies, Oxford Press, \$27.95



It was among the most notorious criminal cases of its day. On August 11, 1921, in Birmingham, Alabama, a Methodist minister named Edwin Stephenson shot and killed a Catholic priest, **Father James Coyle**, in broad daylight and in front of numerous witnesses. The killer's motive? The priest had married Stephenson's daughter Ruth to Pedro Gussman, a Puerto Rican migrant and practicing Catholic. At trial, Father Coyle's killer was found not guilty by reason of self defense. The killer, judge, jury foreman, prosecutor and defense attorney were all members of the Klu Klux Klan.

That Man is You!



The OLP Council is supporting a new men's

study program for the parish. If the new program is approved by Father Kavanagh, we would be the first parish in the diocese to have the program. Brothers **Ed Price** and **Chris George** are working with Deacon Jeff Fortkamp to put together a proposal and iron out some of the details.

What is the Program about? That Man is You! seeks to form men who are fully alive by harmonizing what has typically been referred to as the Three Wisdoms of the Catholic Church: knowledge (secular knowledge including medical and social science); understanding (theology

including Scripture, the Magisterium and Tradition); and wisdom (contemplative or mystical knowledge found primarily in the writings of the saints).

Recognizing that modern men live in and are comfortable with a culture dominated by the findings of secular science, the program makes extensive use of medical and social science. The findings of medical science have proven invaluable in helping men understand the mystery of the human person, created male and female, while the findings of social science have proven indispensable in helping men understand the fundamental importance of marriage and the family to larger society.

Recognizing that the vast majority of men are married at some point in their adult life, the theological content of the program heavily emphasizes the importance of the spousal union in salvation history.

The writings of the saints as well as those of Fr. Marie Dominique Philippe, O.P. founder of the Brothers of St. John, one of the fastest growing contemplative orders in the Church, have proven effective in providing the theological depth lacking in many men's programs.

By harmonizing these "three wisdoms," the program has "opened vistas" and "made the faith come alive" for men in ways that would have been impossible given a more narrow focus. Men consistently consider the content to be the greatest strength of the program.

We will continue to keep you informed on where we are with our efforts and how the program will benefit YOU.
